A civil Norwegian post office ("Postkontoret N.L.") was established in Stockholm in May 1945 in order to dispatch mail between the now liberated country of Norway and Sweden. The post office was destined to use Norwegian postage stamps. "Postkontoret N.L." was in operation from May 15th until August 10th, 1945, and handled the mail sent via the air transport from Luleå to Finmark and vice versa



Letter from Norwegian lieutenant in Norwegian Forces, A.P.O. 7140, stationed at Sandnes by Kirkenes in Finmark, sent via Sweden to Scotland; in Kirkenes censored at the Norwegian censor post office No. 12 (reverse) and labelled "Opened by controller 709", sent by the American Air transport route from Kirkenes to Luleå, and to Stockholm via the Swedish mail routes; in Stockholm dispatched at the Norwegian post office and cancelled "POSTKONTORET N.L. STOCKHOLM 6-6-1945", sent with the American Air bridge, operated by American Overseas Air Lines, from Stockholm to Scotland
