Polmak post office (and Karasjok p.o.) was established on February 1st 1855, in order to dispatch mail across Finnmarksvidda in the winter season. The first postmark in use was a 3-ring numeral canceller, "232", delivered to the sub-postmaster in August 1856

Polmak was one out of 17 Class 3 post offices in Finmark, which due to infrequent dispatch of mail, got no date-stamp in 1859 (Circular letter of December 15th 1858). The sub-post-master used pen manuscript to cancel the mail until he received a 2-ring circular date-stamp in 1885
