The Nordland line

S/S Æger

Bergen - Hammerfest 1851 - 1860 Trondheim - Hammerfest 1860 - 1865

Starting in a connecting service between Bergen and Trondheim, S/S Æger was put into regular service between Bergen and Hammerfest in 1855, sailing in a 3 week cycle with S/S Prinds Gustav and S/S Christiania. After 2 years leave, the ship was re-introduced in the Nordland line in 1858. S/S Ægir sailed in the Bergen-Hammerfest route until 1860, and thereafter in the Trondheim - Hammerfest route. In Nordland post district the sub-postmaster on "Æger", Mr. Hans Severin Øyen, used the date-stamp "NORDLAND" to cancel mail delivered on board. In the north (e. g. in Finmarken amt) and to the south of Nordland post district, the sub-postmaster used pen crosses or pen manuscript and ink to cancel mail handed in on the ship

Local letter of August 23, 1861 (inside), from Karlsø to Tromsø; cover manuscript marked "Æger 26/8" on reverse and postage stamp cancelled with pen strokes; delivered on board S/S Æger on the 26th southbound trip from Hammerfest.

The letter has not passed any superior post office and is therefore without additional postmarks

Only known "Æger" letter in the Nordland line with crossed pen strokes on postage stamp
